

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## Till We Meet Again

This is a recent watercolour painting of mine depicting Kampong Buangkok, Singapore's last remaining village. It reminds me of what our new Health Minister Mr Ong Ye Kung once said: "A GP's care for his patient goes beyond the four walls of his private clinic. He can be the village doctor who understands the patient and his family, helps them manage chronic diseases; the confidant that stubborn family members listen to, and often the link to the wider healthcare network."



This is part of his vision to build a sustainable healthcare system for Singaporeans. Indeed, I like the metaphor of the village doctor – the kampong spirit is a matter of the heart as much as matter of the head. GPs are well-placed to offer scientific, evidence-based care to patients and act as their best advocate, as only a village doctor can do. The ideals of a GP are to look after not just every patient from cradle to grave but the whole three-generation family as well.

Since SKH's opening in 2019, we have busily ramped up our services in the hospital and linked up with community partners, including our GP networks. Now that we've solved most teething problems that came with a new hospital, we can focus on helping Minister Ong achieve his village doctor dream. We have programmes in the pipeline, such as innovative 'full bundle payment' and 'capitation' funding models, which will progressively roll out by end of this year. In essence, there will be funding support flowing outside the hospital from the ministry to facilitate right-siting of services which will be very welcomed.

CMB Prof Ong and I have seen SKH sprout from the ground in the last 10 years, and open on time to serve the community. It's now our pleasant task to hand the helm of SKH over to young and dynamic leaders, Prof Teo Eng Kiong and Prof Hsu Pon Poh. As you get to know them better, you'll appreciate their depth of expertise and understanding of community needs, having honed their skills at Changi General Hospital, a pioneer in many innovative population health initiatives such as GPFirst, also being rolled out in Sengkang.

Sharing this little painting as a souvenir, Prof Ong and I thank you for all your support over the years and look forward to working with you in the future as clinicians in our respective fields. I hope you will give the same support to our incoming leadership team, and work together to fulfill our community mission.
